Math

Tutoring

Share your knowledge or discover your unknown talents by tutoring students in a designated subject area before or after school.

Enrichment Volunteers

Accelerate the education of students in the district's gifted and talented program.

Administer Brain Boosters small group activities and games (30-45 min./week).

Encourage an inquiry based discussion around a short story during Junior Great Books (45 min./week).

Coach a group of 5-7 students in Destination ImagiNation (creative problem solving) or First Lego League (vehicle that completes tasks). Each group meets once a week after school.

Strengthen your computer skills by collaborating with students to help them gather research online, and support them as they sharpen their skills.
