# Intervention & Evaluation Process

## **Parent Guide**



### **Interventions and Progress Monitoring**

- What are interventions? Interventions are evidence based instruction or strategies specifically targeted to identified skills deficits.
- How are they monitored? Students' skills may be monitored through the use of progress monitoring tools, observations, behavior data, or classroom work samples.
- How many interventions and for how long? Teachers and other support staff will complete a minimum of two interventions in the area(s) of concern, typically lasting at least six weeks each.
- What happens after the interventions?
  - If positive & sufficient student growth is made, the team may decide to continue, phase out, or discontinue intervention supports.
  - If two interventions have resulted in negative, limited, or insufficient growth, the team may decide to propose an evaluation to determine eligibility for additional supports through special education.

### **Referral for Special Education**

- Who can refer? Parent or teacher(s) can refer a child for a special education evaluation. If you would like to refer your child for evaluation, please contact your child's counselor or building principal.
- What happens next? You will be contacted to provide additional information regarding your concerns. This information provided may assist with planning additional interventions and/or a comprehensive evaluation based on the areas of concern/educational need.

### **Evaluation for Special Education**

- Why evaluate? In order to determine if your child has a disability that prevents him or her from accessing the general education curriculum without specialized instruction, modifications and/or accommodations.
- What is an evaluation? An evaluation may include formal tests, informal measures, observations, interviews, and a review of educational records and medical history. Several professionals may be involved, and may include a special education teacher, school psychologist, speech/languae pathologist, occupational therapist, adapted physical education teacher, and school nurse. A cultural liaison and/or interpreter may be provided as needed.
- How long does an evaluation take? The evaluation will be completed within 30 school days of the date your signed permission is received by the school.

### **Results**

- What will the evaluation report include? Detailed and summarized information about your child's strengths and needs compared to same age peers. Minnesota criteria for special education will be addressed based on areas of concern.
- My child is eligible for special education services. What does that mean? Your child was determined to have a disabling condition and demonstrates a need for specialized instruction and related services.
- My child does not qualify for special educations services. What does that mean? Your child did not meet eligibility criteria for special education services. His or her educational needs will be addressed through general education.
